Day 1 Verse 11

It is a trustworthy statement: For if we died with Him, we will also live with Him; -2 Timothy 2:11

1. Define *trustworthy*.

2. Why does Paul use this statement and why is it significant?

3. Find 5 other times in Scripture where Paul uses this statement.

- 4. Paul is continuing to use motives for faithfulness. How would telling Timothy, "For if we died with Him, we will also live with Him" motivate Timothy to live faithfully in the face of persecution?
- 5. Why should Christians not fear death, especially in the face of suffering and persecution?

- 6. Some commentators interpret this passage as a spiritual death, rather than Paul encouraging Timothy to be willing to die a martyr's death. What would spiritual death mean in this passage? See Romans 6:11.
- 7. What does it mean to "live with Him"?

a. How can this motivate you to faithful living?

3. Does a moment of weakness prove we aren't saved? See John 13:38; 21:15-17.

a. If you have denied Christ by your words or actions, what must you do? See 2 Corinthians 7:8-11.

4. If we persistently deny Christ without godly sorrow and repentance from sin, what does that prove? See Matthew 7:21-23.

5. What does it mean that "He will deny us"?

6. How would this verse have motivated Timothy to greater faithfulness?

a. How does it motivate you to greater faithfulness?

1. How can we be unfaithful?

2. Is it possible for a believer to be completely faithful to God? Use Scripture to support your answer.

3. How can you be faithful to God?

a. What things do you have in place to do so?

b. Do you have accountability?

4. Are there areas of your life where you see faithlessness? What will you do to change?

5. What encouragement would Timothy have received knowing his timidity would have caused moments of faithlessness?

6. How can God's faithfulness be an encouragement when we sin?
