If you plan on coming out just during the day there is no charge. However, we encourage you to go through the registration process to give us an idea on how many we are planning for.

What to Expect

This camp is about friendships, relaxation and praise. Everyone who was able to come out had a great time of fellowship.

What we do is have a chapel time twice a day. This is at 10:30 am and at 6:30 pm. The short services includes a hymn sing and a sermon.

These are the only scheduled times during the camp. There will be one exception this year; a talent night will take place after the evening chapel time on the Wednesday night

In the evenings we gather round the camp fire to make s'mores, swap stories, discuss theology share, pray, sing, etc.

During the day there is walking, sports, playgrounds, eating, board games, discussions, prayer, etc.

There is also a Picnic Shelter, Washrooms with Hot Showers, Laundry Machines, and Playgrounds.

Activities include Lake Front Beach, Campfires, Nature Trails, Sport Fields, Mini Golf and Sand Volleyball.

What to Bring

Each family or individual is responsible for their own:

- Meals, snacks, beverages, etc.
- Bedding, clothing (for both dry & hot and cool & rainy), swimming suits (modesty please).
- Protections from the elements & nature (sun screen, bug repellent, etc.)
- First Aid kit
- Toiletries (toothpaste, soap, shampoo, etc.)
- Garbage bags
- Firewood

Crafts

Tie-Dye T-Shirts: this is a registered craft. It requires that you bring a t-shirt suitable for dying. The cost is **\$3 per shirt** and is payable with registration.

String Art

Create a piece of art to hang on your wall using nails and coloured string. Please bring your own hammer. **The cost is \$8 per project** and is payable with registration.

Bottle Rockets

Turn a 2L pop bottle into a rocket and launch it up to 100 ft in the air. Fun to build and to watch. Bring your own bottles. **The cost is \$3 per rocket** and is payable with registration.
